Christians, awake! Salute the happy morn

Christmas Day 2022

'Christians awake! Salute the happy morn' is not sung as often as other carols, but it has been a tradition to sing it at St Paul's and St John's on Christmas morning.

The tune is known as 'Stockport' and was composed by John Wainwright who was appointed organist at Manchester Cathedral in 1767. He died and was buried in Stockport in 1768.

The words are from a poem by John Byrom and the original manuscript sits in Chetham's library.

The first time it was sung was by a group of men and boys under the direction of John Wainwright himself, in 1750.

Christians, awake, salute the happy morn, whereon the Saviour of the world was born; rise to adore the mystery of love, which hosts of angels chanted from above; with them the joyful tidings were begun of God incarnate and the Virgin's son.

Then to the watchful shepherds it was told, who heard th'angelic herald's voice: "Behold, I bring good tidings of a Saviour's birth to you and all the nations on the earth: this day hath God fulfilled his promised word, this day is born a Saviour, Christ the Lord."

He spake, and straightway the celestial choir in hymns of joy, unknown before, conspire; the praises of redeeming love they sang, and heav'n's whole orb with alleluias rang; God's highest glory was their anthem still, peace on the earth, and unto men good will.

To Bethl'hem straight the happy shepherds ran, to see the wonder God had wrought for man; and found, with Joseph and the blessed maid, her son, the Saviour, in a manger laid; amazed, the wondrous story they proclaim, the earliest heralds of the Saviour's name.

Isaiah 52.7-10

How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of the messenger who announces peace, who brings good news, who announces salvation, who says to Zion, 'Your God reigns.' Listen! John 1.1-14

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.
